| 1950 | Morley Benjamin Crane, FRS (Honorary Freeman) Geneticist and Plant Breeder Was the first recipient of the Fruiterers' Bursary to the John Innes Horticultural Institution in 1911 Crane did much to encourage and train his junior colleagues He served on many committees of the Ministry of Agriculture, the Royal Horticultural Society, the Agricultural Research Council and the Board of Studies of London university | Ironmongers' Hall On this occasion Mr Crane was also presented with the Honorary Freedom of the Fruiterers' Company Wednesday 25 th January 1950 |
| 1938 | Dr T Wallace Deputy Director of the Department of Agriculture at Bristol University | Mansion House Presented by the Lord Mayor on the occasion of Presentation of Fruit to the Lord Mayor Monday 24 th October 1938 |
| 1931 | Edward Augustine Lowe Laxton, MBE In 1888 Edward formed a partnership with his brother William and founded the business "Laxton Brothers" where Edward was the driving force behind the nursery. They were notable horticulturists, pioneers of plant breeding and experts on fruit production creating several new strains of fruit. The brothers concentrated their attention on crossing the best varieties of apples, pears, plums and small fruits. Lord Lambourne, a dessert apple, raised by Laxton Bros. in 1907 was awarded the RHS Bunyard Cup | The first recipient of the Ridley Medal was Edward Augustine Lowe Laxton. The Medal was presented to him on Tuesday 6 th October 1931 by the Lord Mayor Sir William Phené Neal at a banquet held at Fishmongers' Hall , following the occasion of Presentation of Fruit to the Lord Mayor. |
